Comrades

I wish to express my sincere and personal thanks to the Executive Committee Members for their steadfast support not only for the last year but also through tumultuous time of the last three years. We definitely had some challenging moments, both volunteer-related issues and most importantly restrictions due to COVID,

including multiple closures that we still feel today. We have a few members who have reported ill but they are isolated cases that, thankfully, have not widely spread through the branch. We are closely monitoring the situation and taking actions as required.

The beauty is that Branch 641 is still a very successful branch as

we are growing again and as you can see from the Membership Report on Page 3, we continue to welcome new members every month. My personal prediction is that we will exceed our December 31, 2021 numbers, and I'm hopeful that within two years, we will exceed our highest number of branch members of 657, which was attained just before COVID.

Financially, we are in excellent shape thankfully to the multiple grants that we were able to tap into. For your information, we received just short of \$178,000 through various grants that not only kept us afloat but also allowed us to show a modest growth. Without these grants, we would have been forced to vacate our premises.

The biggest news of all is definitely the progress we made with regards to our new clubhouse project. To have been successful in purchasing a building and to resell all of the condos for a profit is an amazing opportunity that only comes once in a lifetime. With an original investment of \$65,000 and without the need to invest further, we will gain approximately \$400,000 that will be the foundation to finance our new clubhouse. We are so close that it is tangible and with some

To take advantage of the free membership offered by Dominion Command, the new member must complete the online application. Once they receive a membership number, it's a simple process for me to transfer the new member to our branch. The details on how to obtain a free membership can be found at Legion.ca

For conventions, we are entitled to 7 delegates. This number is based on one delegate for the first 50 members, and then one delegate for each 100 members thereafter.

Meet Some of Our Ordinary Members

This month, let's meet Ed Schelenz CD (Maj Ret'd). Ed was born in 1946 and joined the Royal Canadian Navy in 1965. After Basic Training, he served on HMCS Assiniboine and at HMCS Shearwater. In 1972 he reclassified to the Air Observer Trade and served with VP 415 Sqn out of CFB Summerside, HS 443 and HT 406 Sqn out of CFB Shearwater. He accumulated 2,000 hours flying time on the Argus and 1,000 hours on the Sea King.

He was commissioned from the ranks (Sgt) in 1984 and trained as an Air Weapons Controller. On completion of training, he was assigned to Canadian NORAD Region Canada West (51 AC&W Sqn). In 1989, he was posted to Fighter Group/Canadian NORAD Region as a Staff Officer. He was promoted to Major and posted back to 51 AC&W Sqn as a Flight Commander and later became the Ops Officer. He assumed command of 51 AC&W (OT) Sqn July 10, 1994. He transferred from the Regular Force in Jan 1996 after 31 years of service and joined the Air Reserve as a Flt Comd in North Bay for the next 10 years. Ed retired in 2006 with 40+ years of service.

Ed transferred his Legion membership to Branch 641 Barrhaven when he and his wife Ellie moved to Ottawa in 2007. He has 22 years of consecutive membership and in 2020, he was honoured with a Life Membership award by our branch. He's been involved as a volunteer for many years as a bartender, road cleaner, branch cleaner, hospitality volunteer, various executive positions and of course, and two terms as our branch president. Ed is about to embark on his third term as branch president, effective June 1, 2022.


