

Membership Update

At the end of last year, our Membership total for Branch 641 was 560. There are still 50 Members from 2015 who have not renewed for 2016. This represents almost 10 per cent of our Membership. The Branch has done well to attract new Members, and we continue to do so. We now have 548 paid up Members for 2016 with another 16 in the process of becoming a Member. I'm pleased to report that we have now surpassed last year's Membership, and with four months to go, it would be great to add to our total of 564.

Dominion Command reports that 2017 Membership cards have been mailed to all Branches. Cards arrive in two parts. When you renew, you get your membership card and the other part is detached and returned to Dominion Command to show that you have paid/renewed. For those of you who prepaid for 2017 and beyond, your card arrives separately, usually a few weeks later. I will advise the card holders when they arrive.

September is just around the corner and marks the beginning of our Early Bird Campaign which runs from September 1 to the end of November. Again this year, there will be a \$50 draw each month from all Early Bird entries. When you pay your renewal fee of \$50 to the bartender, let them know if you have new contact information, such as a new address, phone number, email address etc.

Finally, if you wait until the Early Bird Campaign is finished it will cost you an additional \$10 to renew. For those of you with mobility issues, you can send your renewal fee to the Branch by mail. Depending on where you live, I will either drop off your new card at your home or send it via mail.
