#### **Poppy Chair Report**

This year's Poppy Campaign runs from October 28-November 10, 2022.

The kickoff meeting was held July 20, 2022. It was well attended and many key positions have been filled on the poppy committee. Poppy distribution, Veterans' Dinner, Remembrance Day Parade and reception were discussed. Some key observations from past experiences were raised and discussed. The committee will incorporate those issues into this year's planning. It is apparent that there are still some gaps within the committee positions. As we know, many hands make for light weight. All but a few positions need a "backup" person to learn and cover the roles. Should the committee members not be able to find a comrade to back them up, I will be asking for a branch wide call for more volunteers to the committee. I will aim to hold the next Poppy Committee Meeting at the end of August.

I can confirm that all but one of the main stores our branch staffs through the campaign have committed they will welcome us back again this year. (Farm Boy, Your Independent Grocer, Loblaws, Metro and Walmart). I'm still trying to reach the Costco Warehouse Manager who is on leave until after the long weekend.

The trap lines are being confirmed and the locations will be contacted throughout the month. On July 28, I received an email from the National Poppy Campaign who notified us that our request for Tap Boxes has been modified and we will receive 12 tap boxes instead of the 20 previously requested.

From the Poppy Manual: "The annual Poppy Campaign is not an administrative chore to be handled by a few branch officers or the secretary. The campaign is the most important branch project of the year and it must be conducted by a committee dedicated to this purpose." Please participate.


