We re-opened on Monday, January 31 and we were all happy to do so. We are in step 1 of 3; step 2 will start February 21 if it is safe to do so.

We will continue with all protocol in place set forth by the Ontario Government.

I would like to welcome some new bartenders, Gerry Langevin who has passed his training as well as Michelle and Joe Guitard who are starting their training.

Under Step 1 we are doing the following:

- 1. All non-members will continue to sign-in as they did pre-COVID.
- 2. A QR code will need to be shown at the door if you are not already registered with the branch.
- 3. Sanitize your hands.
- 4. Masks must be worn while moving around in the branch. Masks can be removed once you sit down.
- A capacity has been set by the Government equal to 50 percent of the capacity in the Bar area, maximum 40, and 75 in Valour Hall. This could change when we go into step 2 on February 21.
- 6. We continue to have two bartenders on duty for each shift. Some discussion has taken place with using other members to assist during slow periods where only one bartender is needed.

Darts has restarted on Wednesday nights along with Friday night dinners. Euchre will be looked at in a few weeks and we are presently discussing hosting Trivia on Tuesday nights. I have set up have set a small group of three to report back on this possibility.

Coming soon to the bar will be some new products and a beverage tasting.

- Mill Street


