
- 1. Basic design

- 4. Budget case prepared


As such, I asked for feedback on the floor plan that was presented at the June General Meeting (and which is shown below).

## **Correct Legion Summer Dress**

To answer recent questions regarding Summer Dress dates, it is from May 1 to September 30 as per the Protocol Manual page 3. However, it is also mentioned that dress for events may be determined in accordance with climatic conditions at all times throughout the year.

Consequently, it opens the door to wear the white or blue shirt before May 1 or after September 30 if the weather is suitable.

When it came out, we received guidance that allows members to wear the blue shirts when applicable. This means that for meetings and when officially representing the branch and when the full uniform may not be appropriate, the blue shirt, grey pants and black shoes can be worn. For unofficial events, blue shirts can be worn but without the requirement of the grey pants and black shoes. Furthermore, there were no comments with regards to the time of the year where the wear of the blue shirt would be restricted, which means that it can be worn throughout the year.

According to Protocol Manual page 3, it also applies to the colour party so summer dress can be worn while carrying the flags.
