Royal Canadian Legion's Bursary Program

As part of the Legion's commitment to Veterans and their families, the Barrhaven Legion among other Legions, may grant bursaries through the Poppy Trust Fund to the children and great-grandchildren of Veterans who require financial assistance to pursue post-secondary education. These bursaries can make a difference for Veterans' and eligible family members and offers these students an opportunity to further their education goals. Bursaries may be granted at any stage of a college or university program.

Local branches, including Branch 641 and Provincial Command, develop their eligibility requirements, deadlines and application procedures. The Bursary Program runs from September 1 to October 31 of the current academic year. Applications can be hand delivered to the branch or sent by mail. More information is available on our website.

There is also the Ontario command level bursary students can apply for from September 1 to the last Friday in March for the current academic year. <u>More information is available here.</u>

Additionally, Allied Van Lines is pleased to offer qualifying Canadian students a chance to apply for their scholarship, which is intended for students across the areas of business, logistics and similar fields. Four qualified candidates will be selected to receive an award of \$1,000 each. Remembrance Through Light

Starting on October 27, 117,000 poppies representing Fallen Canadian Veterans since the First World War will cascade virtually upon the Peace Tower at **Parliament Hill** and on the Senate

building. The **Poppy Drop** will take place until November 11, from 6:30–9:30 pm ET.

On November 5, 10, and 11, the display will extend to midnight. Virtual poppies will also cascade down the **National Art**Centre's "Kipnes Lantern" on November 11, from 7:00 am ET to midnight ET.


