Barrhaven Legion has donated \$30000.00 since 2015. The unofficial agreement pre COVID, was to donate \$50000.00 in 5 years.

CHEO is in desperate need to replace their crib stretchers which are 22 years old! They are looking to replace 14 of them and each crib stretcher costs approximately \$8,800.00.

Crib stretchers support surgery and procedures in small children and babies. Crib stretchers allows them to safely transport the small precious patients between critical care areas in the hospital. The adjustable side guards and height adjustability allows the medical team to provide oxygen, support mechanical ventilation and even a CODE BLUE if necessary.

These modern cribs stretchers will get many years of use at CHEO and will help them safely care for our smallest and most vulnerable patients undergoing anesthesia and surgery.
